### Pantomima - group 1 (early-stage researchers)

4 easy (1 minute per MWE)

- 1. **a pain in the neck** A source of annoyance, a nuisance
- 2. **to take the bullet by the horns** to confront a problem head-on and deal with it openly.
- 3. **to spill the beans** to give away a secret or a surprise
- 4. **to strike while the iron is hot** When you have an opportunity to do something, do it before you lose your chance.

# 4 medium (2 minutes per MWE)

- 1. **cranberry word** In linguistic morphology, a cranberry morpheme (or fossilized term) is a type of bound morpheme that cannot be assigned an independent meaning or grammatical function, but nonetheless serves to distinguish one word from the other.
- red tape The collection or sequence of forms and procedures required to gain bureaucratic approval for something, especially when oppressively complex and timeconsuming.
- 3. **to sell like hot cakes** to be sold very fast.
- 4. **to trip the light fantastic** To dance. (in particular engage in ballroom dancing)

1. **by and large** – on the whole, everything considered

# Pantomima - group 2 (senior researchers)

4 easy (1 minute per MWE)

- 1. **it rains cats and dogs** To rain very heavily.
- 2. **to kick the bucket** To die.
- 3. **to let the cat out of the bag** To let a secret be known.
- 4. **to pull strings** make use of one's influence and contacts to gain an advantage unofficially or unfairly.

### 4 medium (2 minutes per MWE)

- 1. **a part of speech** The parts of speech are the primary categories of words according to their function in a sentence.
- 2. **a piece of cake** something easy to do.
- 3. **to shoot the breeze** to chat casually and without purpose.
- 4. **to know which side your bread is buttered** Be aware of where one's best interests lie.

1. **all of a sudden** – suddenly
